#### 9 Lifesaving Report.

9.1 Good start to patrolling season. Have noted our flags are beginning to show wear and tear. Suggest looking into new patrol flags for next season.

9.2 We have 2 ARTC kits. Suggest we contact Health Dynamics to place an order for another one, as we need a reserve.

9.3 Also great to see plenty of volunteers putting up their hand to help for the Cleaver patrol when they were short ofnumbers.

9.4 Bronze and SRC groups had their assessments last week, on the 12 Dec Wednesday. 2 proficiencies have been held so far. There were around 30 people each session. Another session has been addedfor Tuesday 18<sup>th</sup> Dec.

- 9.5 We still need to follow up with some people on whether they can commit to a patrol team, or, ifapplicable, as an active reserve.

9.6 MAST session was held with 9 participants – 6 of which were from USLSC. Hope this will lead to new IRBDs.

9.7 Need to ensure all patrol captains have a key to access the club for setting up patrols. Not all P.Cs have one at the moment.

9.8 Note to future patrols; wildlife (aka. The blue tongue lizard) have been found inside the club house on multiple occasions now. Reminder just to keep an eye out when roller doors are open

9.9 Observation that whilst Buttons Beach is popular, only a small number of swimmers along the beach actually swim in the flags. As lifesavers patrolling, we are responsible to look out for all swimmers along Buttons Beach.

9.10 We wish to make the surf cub environment of a more appealing place for beach goers and club members. We would like to propose that patrols can set up the speakers, like on carnival days, and play music during patrol hours, in hope we attract more people to the area.
We are open further to other suggestions on how to make the club more inviting.

9.11 We also have been wanting to introduce the idea of patrol incentives to our lifesavers – if all are happy for it. This hopefully will encourage lifesavers to turn up for their rostered patrols. Ideas include;

- Free drink vouchers for the bar
  - Money rebate on membership fees
- Discount on counter meals
- Any other ideas?
