President's Report

Firstly, welcome to the AGM, a packed 12 months have passed since the previous one. A season that has seen the club consolidate after a fractured start.

We have seen how a reduction in club numbers can put pressure on the nucleus of people who make any club function. However, I feel that the board has worked efficiently and with a sense of shared purpose, supported by club members who have ensured successful outcomes. This can be seen through the following; the Australia Day Event, hosting a weeklong National Veterans Motor Cycle event, supporting the SLST Development Camp, supporting a double header carnival and the continuation of our successful counter meal and breakfast sessions.

I would draw your attention to the Life Saving and Surf Sports reports, however, I must acknowledge my thanks to the leaders of these areas as they have ensured that the Club has met every benchmark required of us. I would, however, ask all members to be mindful of the club's needs and to strive to reconcile what they think they can offer and what realistically can be achieved.

A constant flow of information was disseminated to members throughout the season via social media or other electronic means, eg our updated website www.ulverstoneslsc.org or heaven help us, face to face/person to person contact!

I think this has helped the club successfully navigate the season.

I made mention above of the Board's ability to work together. This has enabled decisions affecting the future running of the club to be made in a timely manner;

- Obtained funding (Tasmanian Community Fund) for the installation of Solar Panels on the club.
- Utilised the Tasmanian State Government's \$25,000 grant for Life Saving Equipment.
 Due to an ongoing saga in relation to unavailability of new IRBs the board has made the
 purchase of a late model 4x4 (Holden Colorado twin cab & canopy). When available
 the board will purchase a new IRB out of retained club funds. The outgoing board have
 set this as first priority for the next season.
- Taken advantage of an offer from SLSA to replace the Can Am with the latest model.
- Obtained grants from Federal Government's Stronger Communities Grant & Volunteers Grants to close in the club's through way, allowing for rescue equipment storage and purchase of new fuel bladders and radios.
- Replaced 3 rescue boards & 5 rescue tubes.
- Upgraded all audio-visual equipment in the Binni Room and the hall, as well as installing Heat Pumps in Binni Room and Office.
- Installed Sound Reduction Panels in the hall and resurfaced the hall floor.
- Upgraded all hall/bar/IRB shed lighting.


- Committed to upgrading the First Aid Room with running hot water.
- Recommenced our Sunday Water Awareness sessions at the East Ulverstone Pool.
- Responded to last year's AGM to upgrade the club's constitution and by-laws with updated versions.
- Investigated the implications of Tas Water's demands for installation of a Trade Waste tank.

Challenges

- Sponsors- what do we want and what can we offer or are prepared to offer and who do we seek?
- Building on numbers, both in the senior ranks and the juniors.
- Maintaining training standards and course offerings.
- Community Relevance.

In closing it is pleasing to note that little will change in the composition of the next board as I see continuity at this level as being the first step in consolidating on this season's gains.

Life Saving Report

Six patrol teams operated this season, supported by an Active Reserve of 7 members. Average membership of each team was 8 and each was rostered for 6 days, that is, for 30 hours. There were 4 Club Patrols: Christmas Day, Australia Day and Junior and Senior State-wide carnivals.

This season 68 members completed their Skills Maintenance Assessments and 57 performed lifesaving duties.

Seventeen individuals trained and gained 31 new lifesaving awards. Meggan Booth and Lara Emmett continued their work as Trainee Training Officers and Mike Holland was Chief Training Officer. The Club is seriously in need of more people to become actively involved as trainers. It's also essential that more trainers get assessor qualifications.

This year, Isabel Porter attended the state-wide Lifesaving Development Camp and returned with enhanced skills and several new awards. Lara Emmett, Mike Holland, Chris Jacobson, Jack and Nick Wood were trainers and leaders at LDC.

It's great that so many of our lifesavers compete in surf sports events. However, state-wide surf carnivals, ocean swim events and weekend work rosters leave us struggling to get enough members with the appropriate skill sets onto the beach each weekend. A review of patrol team and roster arrangement is to be undertaken to find fresh ways to address this.

This has been an outstanding year for updating our lifesaving resources. 2 Tohatsu motors have been purchased. The old CanAm Defender-Pro SSV was sold and replaced with a current model vehicle and two I-com patrol radios, 3 Bennett surf rescue boards and 5 new surf rescue tubes have been purchased. The aging Ford Ranger utility has been sold and has been replaced with a Holden Colarado Twin Cab with canopy. Funding for this vehicle came from the State Government.

Thank you to everyone who helped Ulverstone SLSC deliver its public safety service for the Ulverstone community especially to those who substituted for absent members or volunteered for extra duties. Some were outstanding. Tully O'Neil and Alison Purton 70+ hrs, Deb Walton, Lara Emmett and Mike Holland 60+ hrs, and Andrew McMahon 50+ hrs. Congratulations to Alison who was presented with the Dot Wilson Best Patrol Person Award.
